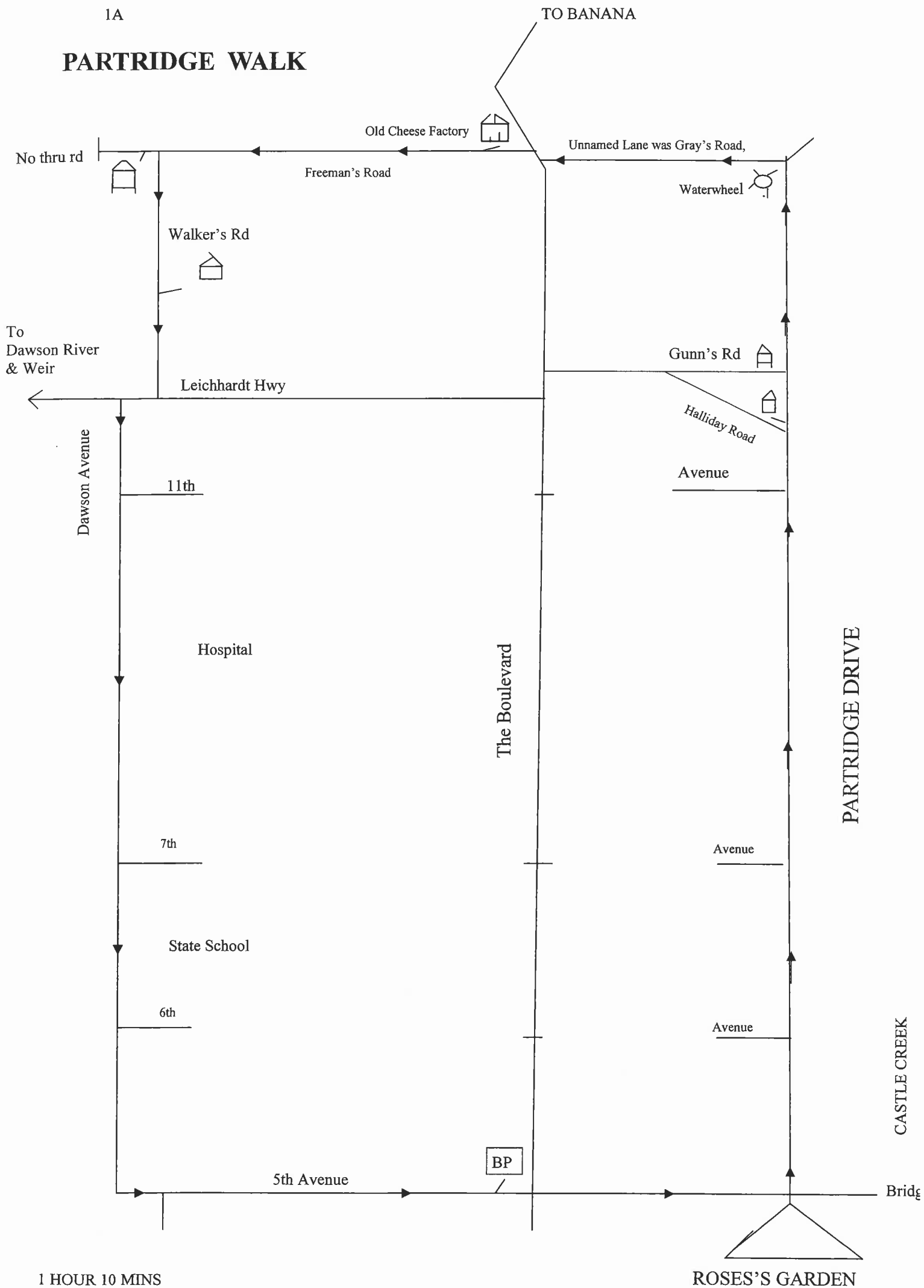


# PARTRIDGE WALK

## PARTRIDGE WALK

**DISTANCE:** 6.7km

**TIME:** 1 hour 15 mins (approx)

**Rose's Garden:** established from a landscape of weeds, rubbish and shoulder high long grass in 1995 to a enchanted garden on the banks of Castle Creek. Named after the creators Jeanette & Spencer Rose.

**Partridge Dr:** named after the Commissioner of Irrigation and Water Supply. Who often visited Castle Creek (Theodore) during it's development.

**11th Avenue:** 10 mins. Is the second of only two streets in town which connect the town in a east-west direction.-Dawson Ave The Boulevard and Partridge Drive

**Gunn's Road:** 23 mins. Named after local identities Philis a school teacher and Charlie a cotton farmer, lived in house on corner.

**Waterwheel:** 27mins (Gray's Rd). A land mark in Theodore's history being established as the first Irrigation & Water Scheme in Queensland in 1922.

**Freeman's Road:** 36mins. Named after locals who were big producers of vegetables and fruit for the district.  
Old Cheese Factory: Established in about 1940 to supply cheese to the troops in south east Asia. The area was a huge dairy cow farmland and soon after WW2, the business closed and the dairy cow soon disappeared from the Theodore landscape.

**Walker's Rd:** 41mins. Named after a original worker in the IWS (Irrigation and Water Supply)

**Leichhardt H'way:**56mins. Named after Ludwig Leichhardt who left the Darling Downs in October 1844, to explore country north to Port Essington near Darwin. As he went, he named many rivers, one of them being the Dawson..

**Hospital:** 1hr 5 mins. Original hospital was built in 1962, was burnt down in March 1976 and replaced by current one which opened on 27th November1976.

**5th Avenue:** 1 hour 11mins. Is the first of two streets that connect the town in a east-west direction.
